

Adults to get benefit from reading classes

Victoria R.E.A.D. plans to make its services in diagnosing and remedial reading problems more accessible to adults, a spokesman for the organization said Monday.

Mario Strauss said Victoria R.E.A.D. will begin offering night classes for adults who cannot attend classes during the day or on Saturdays, when the office is usually open.

A non-profit society aimed at helping those with reading problems, Victoria R.E.A.D. uses small classes or individ-

ual instruction. Its clients range from elementary school students to adults.

Strauss said the organization has been unsuccessful in getting government recogni-

tion of its work, and it exists mainly on tuition fees paid by its students.

Strauss said many people are referred to its offices at 720 Linden by friends.
