# Project can aid students

Students needing extra help in such subjects as language, arts and arithmetic could get that help from Project READ, formerly known as Project Catch-Up.

Project READ, which stands for Reading Evaluation and Development, is a non-profit tutorial service which will be reopening Oct. 11.

From January to June of this year, it was known as Project Catch-Up and was financed through a Local Initiatives Program (L.I.P.) grant. The L.I.P. and Opportunities For Youth (OFY) programs were subsequently curtailed by the federal government in an economy move.

Project READ will charge \$5 an hour for students.

A staff of four qualified teachers, headed by Ann Boher, will offer special instruction to students who cannot be fully accommodated by special programs offered through the school districts.

Students may attend for one hour or more during the school day with no more

than three students allotted per teacher.

A general meeting will be held Sept. 15 at the University of Victoria's Coronet Building, Room 163, starting at 8 p.m.
